### C. College Of Nursing Scholarship

The Gold and Silver Scholarships are mainly merit based; while the Bronze and Book Scholarships in the College of Medicine and College of Physical Therapy are need based. The grant assistances are given to in the 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> year levels.

The Special Honors Awards (SHA), and the Dr. Arnel Malaya Book Scholarship (sponsored by Class 1982) are awarded to incoming freshmen.

2013 Scholarship program made up 55% of the total program expense and 46% of the total expense of the Foundation. The last 5-year average was 46% and 33% respectively. Grants for SY 2013-2014

For the year 2013 which covers SY 2013-2014, the total grant to individuals was \$27,400. Of this amount \$19,500 went for tuition fees; and, \$15,125 recognition and honors awards including book scholarship. (See Table 1)

# How is the program doing?

Data from 2003 to 2013 show that... (See Table 3 and 4)

- The scholarship program has granted **672** units; **362** units to tuition grants and **310** units to book scholarship.
- Of the 362 units for tuition; 156 went to the SHA, 151 for the Bronze scholarship, 34 for Silver and 14 for Gold scholarships.
- The <u>recognition and honors awards</u> have granted a total of **696** units; for a total of **1369** units in grants to individuals.

Overall, we are spending less than 300 dollars per student in assistance thru book, bronze (Partial) scholarships, and special honors assistance; which makes up 91 percent of the recipients. On the hand, we spend an average of \$1500 for the other 7% in the Gold and Silver Scholarships.

Can we draw some conclusions from the data presented whether this program is effective and fulfilling mission? What measures are we going to use? Is it mainly the numbers supported? Perhaps, we need more data and can only come from the Medical School like:

- The number of recipients who have gone on to graduate on time
- The number of recipients who passed the boards on first take
- How many of the recipients made it to the top 10 in the national boards
- How many of the Gold and Silver Scholar recipients made it to the top 10 in the national boards?
