In November, 2008, I with President Romy Divinagracia, had a person to person meeting with Mr. Wilson Young, CEO, UERMMMC, in his Office at the Medical Center. We discussed the present conditions of the infrastructure of the Medical Center with emphasis on the old and outdated University Teaching Hospital. Mr. Young told me that they are now looking for a lot near or with close proximity to the Medical Center to build a new University Hospital. He also promised me that during his tenure he will be proactive and also be very sensitive with the new problems facing the Medical Center including the parking situation which is atrocious and also a deterrent to increasing the census of private patients at the University Hospital. Dr. Aquilino Esquerra who eventually became a faculty in Neuropsychiatry after being a Professor of OB-GYN gave the history and life of Dr. Zaguire including his accomplishments and contributions to academic neuropsychiatry and organized medicine. I also gave other lectures to the Sophomore Class on "Humanism and Professionalism in Medical Practice" and "Geriatric Pharmacology & Therapeutics" at the request of Dean Retta Reyes and Dr. Ronald Macaraig, Head, Department of Pharmacology. My other commitments did not allow me to attend the yearly homecoming celebration at the Medical Center and the Crowne Plaza Hotel.

It was also a great honor to be the first Paz Y. Fores, M.D. Memorial Lecturer at the Makati Medical Center on Feb. 3, 2009. Dra. Fores was the first Chair of Anesthesiology at the Catholic University of the Philippines and the UST Hospital. She was also one of the pioneers among those who founded and initiated the Philippine Board of Anesthesiology, Inc. For my presentation, the Organizing Committee selected "The Prevention of Human Errors in Medicine and Medical Practice. I met Dr. Ariston Bautista who was Professor of ENT when I was a medical student at the UERMMMC.

Then for the rest of the 3 weeks I was on the Medical/Surgical Mission with the PAGES-Operation HOPE at the Nueva Ecija Provincial Hospital, Cabanatuan, Nueva Ecija sponsored by Gov. Umali; the Rizal Provincial Hospital, Morong, Rizal sponsored by Gov. Ynares, M.D.; and the Ospital Ng Maynila, Manila, sponsored by Mayor Lim. We were doing oral-maxillofacial surgery with emphasis on cleft lips, palates and other maxillo-facial deformities.

The shipment will cost \$90.00 via the balikbayan box route to the Philippines from Louisville, KY.
